gathered, all the materials found were post-Urartian. 6 m from the main fortress wall an inner wall was found, showing that the fortress extended northwards. Another  $3 \times 3$  test trench was excavated in a cave southeast of the fortification, used as a chapel during the Middle Ages. Here was found also a small amount of pottery going back to VII-VI centuries B.C.
